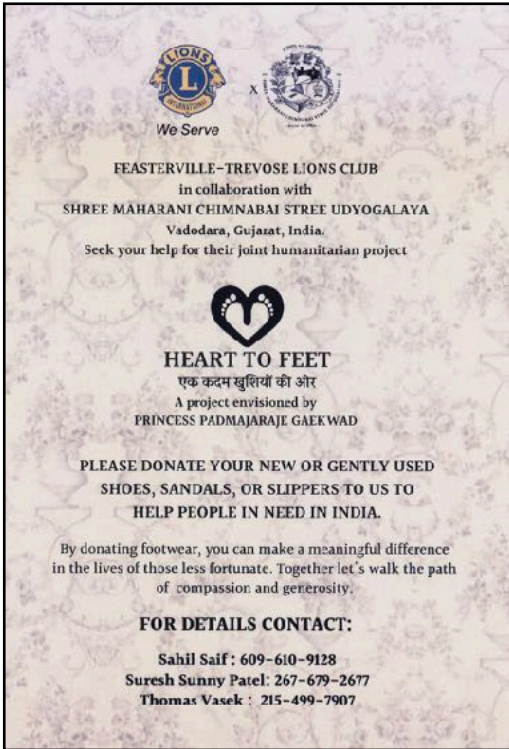

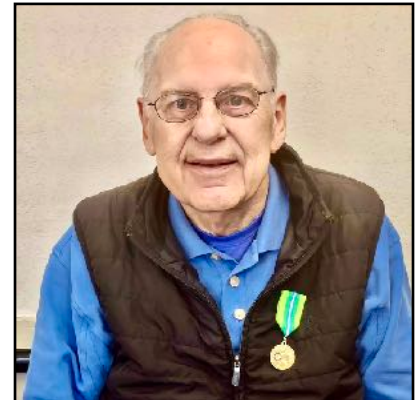

**In Memoriam - ROBERT THOMAS YOKL, a Dedicated Lion**

In lieu of our featured Member Spotlight, it's fitting to acknowledge a tribute to Bob Yokl who spent over 52 years serving as a dedicated Lion, first with the Willow Grove Lions Club and then the Skippack Lions Club, serving as president in both clubs. He also served as the Lions Philadelphia Region Diabetes chairman. He was a recipient of the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award, the highest form of recognition and embodies humanitarian ideals consistent with the nature and purpose of Lionism. Bob passed away July 12, 2024 from cancer. He was 81.



Funeral services were held on July 19, 2024. In lieu of flowers, contributions may be made in his memory to the Skippack Lions Club, P. O. Box 159, Skippack, PA 19474.

Bob was instrumental in overseeing the development of a new and improved website for the District 14A Charitable Foundation. Lion Jim Bodnar assisted in it's implementation.

Born January 9, 1943, in Philadelphia, PA. He was a 1960 graduate of Cardinal Dougherty High School and attended Temple University. He was also a veteran of the United States Navy.

Mr. Yokl started his company, SVAH Solutions, in 1987 in Willow Grove, PA. He later moved the company in 1993 to its current location in Skippack, PA. In 2018, he was inducted into the Healthcare Supply Chain Hall of Fame's Bellwether League for his lifetime of service and innovation.

In his younger days, Mr. Yokl was a regular dancer on the Grady & Hurst TV Dance Show. He was a voracious reader, a talented writer, and loved Broadway radio music and the Mummies. He and his wife were part of a special group of friends called The Gourmet Dinner Group that got together often for good food and laughs. He enjoyed time spent with long-time friends and was dearly loved by his family.
